**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

We, the Citizens of the Soviet Union, the United States, Canada, Great Britain, Ireland, France, Spain, Sweden, Denmark, Switzerland, Finland, India, and South Africa, having met at Citizens' Summit II in Moscow, January 21-26, 1990, at the Conference *Restoring the Global Environment: Sustainable Models for the New Millennium*, hereby resolve to exercise our authority and responsibility as global citizens to achieve the following goals by the year 2000:

**Environment**

- Reduce all national defense and intelligence community budgets by not less than 50% and redirect funds to areas of global human need and environmental restoration.
- Stabilize planetary population at appropriate carrying capacity levels for all forms of life.
- Establish a very well-funded International Green Cross administered by UNEP to facilitate international cooperation on restoration of ecological areas that are globally significant to life on earth.
- End debt burden of Third World countries through debt forgiveness, debt for nature swaps, and debt exchange for a clear commitment to restore their respective environments and to implement sustainable solutions.
- Restructure all international aid and World Bank-related grants and loans to focus on funding sustainable programs, technologies, and futures.
- Establish an International Peace Park where the Berlin Wall once stood, with trees and flowers planted by the children of the World.
- Increase the standard of living in developing countries to eliminate mass poverty (often a major cause of environmental degradation) through available health care, education, sustainable agriculture, and efficient and renewable energy technologies.
- Halt deforestation, including that of the rain forests, and set remaining forests aside as parks, indigenous people's reserves and extractive reserves.
- Commence global and ecologically appropriate reforestation, planting not less than 130 million hectares of trees in developing countries and 40 million hectares in industrial ones.
- Phase out ozone depleting chemicals by 1995.
- Protect, unequivocally, the fresh surface and ground water resources and reserves of Earth for the future of all life.
- Initiate major recycling programs, globally, for solid and hazardous waste.
- Expand UNEP to a much more powerful and well-funded U.N. Agency, with strong global enforcement powers.



## **Energy**

- Establish a global energy conservation policy that will achieve the goal of a sustainable future for all life.
- Reduce carbon dioxide emissions by 20% by 2000 and by 50% by 2020.
- Increase energy efficiencies by 20-30% by 2000 and achieve global energy efficiency parity by 2005.
- Develop renewable energy resources to a level of 25% of total energy production.

## **Economics**

- Establish national and global “all of life”-centered economic systems that create a more productive, equitable, and environmentally sound society for all.
- Replace GNP calculations for all nations with Sustainability Indexing (SI) based on total life cycle accounting for all resource-impacting activities.
- Convert armaments into ecologically sustainable development.

## **Conflict Resolution**

- Establish a Soviet-American Center for Conflict Resolution to facilitate the resolution of Soviet-American and other relevant societal problems.

## **Global Security**

- Encourage President Gorbachev to continue to exercise the visionary leadership he has demonstrated in recent history and to unilaterally stop the testing of nuclear weapons, expedite nuclear and conventional forces disarmament, and encourage the US to join in these disarmament and moratorium initiatives for the benefit of all life on Earth.

## **US-USSR Think Tank**

- Establish a Global Think Tank to facilitate the earliest possible realization of an interdependent, sustainable future for all the peoples of Earth.
- Implement a Peace Room, a globally accessible interactive communications and information system using a decentralized community-oriented network to facilitate the democratic exchange of information, activities and ideas between citizens and organizations.

## **Business and Trade**

- Achieve a business environment in which human potential *can* be realized through unrestricted markets while allocating sufficient resources to restore the global environment.

## **Holistic Health and Healing**

- Co-create a global society which supports each individual, each family, each nation, and all life forms in attaining the highest level of excellence in personal, environmental, and planetary health.

## **Youth and Education**

- Develop educational systems which exemplify the global interdependency of humans and the natural world and strategies which empower each person to join with others in the truest sense of Community with all life forms, to be responsible stewards of Planet Earth.
- Adopt a global standard for sustainable development that involves assessing the impact a proposed action will have on the seventh generation of your children.



## **Religion and Spirituality**

- Restructure society through religious and spiritually based commitments that emphasize a global appreciation of the majestic beauty, interconnectedness, diversity, and unity of all peoples, cultures, and life on earth.

## **Human Rights: The Interdependence of All Life**

- Empower all people on Earth and their uniqueness and diversity by co-creating and implementing a global Declaration of People's and Nature's Rights and Responsibilities, based on the principle that all people are accountable and responsible for the social and environmental effects of their actions.

## **Communications: Print Media**

- Expand and facilitate the exchange of information between the media of the US and the USSR, with an emphasis on our common future and restoring the global environment.

## **Communications: Visual Arts, A Bridge to World Cooperation**

- Utilize the arts to convey to all peoples of the Earth the life-loving symbols and myths that foster the highest potential of humankind—to live with Peace on Earth, at Peace with Earth.

## **Women for Change**

- Restructure all institutions and aspects of social, political, economic, and cultural life so that women and men may serve as equal partners, nurturing and protecting our children and all life on earth in joy, with unconditional love, on a healthy boundary-less planet of "green forests, blue rivers, and smiling suns."

## **International Citizens' Diplomacy and Developing Countries**

- Develop a sustainable future by using the significant achievements of Soviet-American citizen diplomats as a model for an expanded, globally-focused citizen diplomacy set of healing initiatives.

## **Games, Stories and Myths for the New Millennium**

- Allow children to play a vital role in domestic and international negotiations by creatively contexting them in processes where their presence will positively impact on a desired, sustainable future.

## INTRODUCTION

Addressing the United Nations General Assembly on December 7, 1988, Soviet President Gorbachev called for "*the kind of cooperation that could more accurately be termed co-creation and co-development.*" As we enter the decade of the 90s, we see a common goal for the peoples of this planet that clearly requires this quality of cooperation, not only between the Soviets and Americans, but among all nations and cultures.

We know that our generation has been given the heroic challenge of restoring our physical and social environment to meet the growth and basic needs of humanity. Accomplishing this goal requires this quality of cooperation, co-creation, and co-development to create a sustainable future for life on the earth by the year 2000.

The Soviet-American Citizens' Summit is such a process. Citizens' Summit I initiated over one hundred active joint projects. With Citizens' Summit II, Soviet and American Citizens have outlined common desired futures and shared goals and have started more than another one hundred joint projects.

Over 200 Americans and 300 Soviet citizens, from all walks of life and from many sectors of society, worked together for five days in the Cosmos Hotel, Moscow, between January 21 and 25, 1990. They met in over twenty task forces and round tables on such topics as the environment, energy, economics, youth and education, business and trade, wholistic health and healing, communications, spirituality and religion, and the arts. After co-creating their desired future and shared goals, they focussed on co-developing joint Soviet-American projects. A variety of leading social innovators in the U.S. and U.S.S.R., including Noel Brown, Special Representative for North America of the UN Environmental Program; Hazel Henderson, Global Economist and Author; Sergi Tolstoi, MD, grandson of Leo Tolstoi; David Brower, Founder, Sierra Club, Friends of the Earth, and Earth Island Institute; Vladimir Pozner, noted Soviet television personality; Daniel Ellsberg, Global Security Futurist; and Mikhail Milstein, Retired USSR General and Researcher, US-Canada Institute and USSR Academy of Sciences; as well as many others, also presented inspiring addresses on new ways to address identified global issues through joint cooperation.

A Citizens Summit II document was produced calling for a Decade of Citizen's Cooperation to Restore the Global Environment, stating the co-created desired futures, common goals, and joint projects. This Summit document, *Restoring the Global Environment: Sustainable Models for the New Millennium* will be presented to President Gorbachev and President Bush, other leaders world-wide, and the media. Summit II will thus set the stage for Summit III in 1992; building on the prior successes of Soviet and American Citizens by including citizens from all countries to help unite humanity for our common sustainable future in the new millennium.

The Citizens Summit concluded on Thursday evening, January 25, with all Soviet and American delegates and their families attending a celebratory Evening Gala Awards Ceremony and Concert. Joseph Eger, President and Artistic Director of the Symphony for the United Nations conducted the Moscow State Orchestra, Yurlov Choir, and Children's Chorus in a stunning performance of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony, in the historically significant Hall of Columns in Moscow. The *Ode to Joy* is a *musical celebration of the value and unity of all life*—a fitting postlude to Citizens' Summit II.

## Global Ecology and Environment

### Desired future:

We believe the United States and the Soviet Union have not only been involved in the arms race, but also have been the major polluters and major inefficient consumers of natural resources. And therefore we believe that the whole style of the relationship between our two countries should be changed and that the environment should be the core issue for cooperation between us, as it is the case for this Citizens' Summit.

The funds spent now for military purposes would go for the cause of the environment both inside the Soviet Union and the United States and in the developing countries.

It is not only money, but it is the new style of life which is based on the code for environmental ethics to be elaborated by both the Americans and Soviets.

We believe that our two countries should lead the way toward the establishment of new environmental ethics and behavior for all of humanity.

This is the current way of thinking, and even at this meeting we had at least three documents circulated on this subject.

We propose that one document should be developed on these and similar suggestions to be presented to the whole world on EarthDay 1990. We charge the Soviet Peace Committee and the Center for Soviet-American Dialogue to prepare and present such a document, a "Citizens' Commitment for the Earth."

### Desired future:

We propose that the nations of the world jointly work for an energy policy to save our planet and our economies.

### Shared goals and strategies:

- We can develop renewable energies so that we can use renewable fuels to power our energy needs.
- In the short run, our vision is increased energy efficiency.
- We propose a joint clearinghouse to research and develop clean, energy-efficient technologies.
- By the year 2000, we propose that energy efficiency be increased by 50% and that CO2 emissions be cut by 20% by the year 2000 and that the US and USSR cut these emissions by 35% reductions.
- Internationally, there must be an agreed-upon energy policy.
- Nationally all governments must agree on regulations to increase auto fuel efficiency
- Cut the energy used in buildings, lighting and appliances.
- Investments in energy should go to R & D in energy efficiency technologies.
- We must cut down personally on our use of energy.
- Energy should be linked to ecology and therefore to alternative sources or to energy savings.

- Joint publication of a journal on alternative sources of energy with a publisher and translation in the US.
- Joint energy efficient technology exhibition
- Joint venture on alternative energy sources in the Crimea
- A global energy system, with a representative of the US delegation appearing on Channel 1 of Soviet National TV to describe the background of the project to the broad Soviet audience.

### **Desired future:**

A world in which conflict is resolved without violence and in ways that maximize the gain of all the disputants.

### **Joint Projects:**

- Soviet-American Center for Conflict Resolution:

This center will be located in Moscow and will be an independent institution which includes the best aspects of official and unofficial support but which avoids the bureaucratic perils of being too closely connected with any single organization or sector. The Center will train mediators and trainers to deal with ethnic problems, labor disputes, law reform, educational conflict, and international problems. The Center will also conduct or facilitate research in conflict resolution, and will carry on educational functions for the public as a whole to advance the use of conflict resolution methodology to help solve societal problems.

## **Global Security**

### **Co-Chairs**

### **Desired future:**

We have a vision of a global home to be achieved in the near future in the shape of a European home with a sign over the door saying "No nuclear welcome here." The people and nations dwelling there must delegitimize war and promote the need to reject nuclear and non-nuclear strategies of war.

### **Shared goals and strategies:**

- Two major treaties on nuclear and non-nuclear weapons provide a context in which major unilateral initiatives taken by either side could become politically feasible, such as the cessation of immediate nuclear weapons testing, the immediate ending of the production of fissionable material for nuclear weapons, the immediate removal of nuclear weapons from naval surface ships and from overseas bases. We should press the Congress to follow Mikhail Gorbachev's leadership in these tasks.
- Examples of arms control and foreign policy initiatives are encouraging Gorbachev to unilaterally stop the testing of nuclear weapons for the next two years and that he be encouraged to make this permanent if the US will join this moratorium on testing.

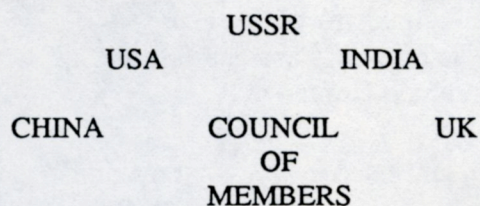
