The Center for Soviet–American Dialogue began in 1984 when Rama Vernon was inspired to dedicate herself to insure a safe and peaceful world for her children and all future generations. Through her work in the United States and her 34 trips to the Soviet Union (as of this writing), she has endeavored to create new, more open structure for personal interaction between Americans and Soviets.

As of today, CSAD has taken over 1200 Americans to the Soviet Union, and conducts an ongoing program of open conferences and professional exchanges where both American and Soviet citizens have the opportunity to meet with their official and non-official counterparts.

Highlights of CSAD work include lighting 7,000 candles in Moscow in a "World Instant of Cooperation in 1986," "A New Way of Thinking in the Nuclear Age" symposium in 1987, and the First Soviet-American Citizens' Summit in Washington, DC, which included 100 Soviets and 500 Americans meeting to create over 100 joint projects.

Soviet Peace Committee

The Soviet Peace Committee is a public organization started in 1949 and serving public needs for more than four decades, expressing public interests and uniting initiatives in the fields of peace, ecology, human rights and citizen diplomacy.

At the moment more than 400 prominent Soviet public activists are elected as members of the Committee. It relies upon a network of 157 local peace committees in national republics and cities throughout the country.

During the decades of its operation, the Soviet Peace Committee has accomplished several thousand citizen diplomacy projects involving citizens of all continents. Among the projects of the Committee are Soviet-American Peace Marches, Volga and Mississippi Peace Cruises, peace missions to Afghanistan, humanitarian aid and cultural missions to many Third World countries. Soviet Peace Committee has started many initiatives in the field of disarmament. It also supports many local ecological project across the USSR.
