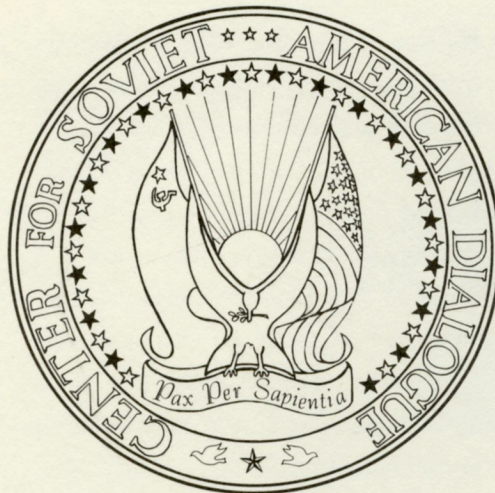


***A Select Gathering for Media, Film and
